




I see my grandson is having better luck with the TR6 than I did. John P

Hey John, thought I'd take advantage of Friday's nice weather and do a little maintenance on my car. A couple weeks ago I ordered a water pump and thermostat from Moss Motors. Since I had decided to flush the entire system, I removed the lower radiator hose to drain the old coolant. Then removed water pump and thermostat. Since I wanted to flush the block as well as radiator, I put a garden hose in the water pump hole until it ran clear out the bottom. Did the same with radiator. After all the water was drained out, I replaced the lower radiator hose and installed the new water pump. Added new coolant into the block through the thermostat housing until it ran out the top of radiator making sure air bubbles got out. Put in the new thermostat, attached the radiator hose and fired it up. Let it run about 15 minutes then went on about a twenty minute test drive. Temp. is perfect and best of all, no water pump noises and no leaks!

P.S. I asked a couple neighbors if they knew who owned the TR6. Nobody does and they have never seen anyone around there. The windshield has an old New York inspection sticker on it. I'll keep an eye out for a car over there.





Greasy Hands Garage North Update by John Phillips

4/7/2025 –Last month I said this, "It ran very good before, but the sound is so much better with the rebuilt head. I am getting a little excited about this car".

So, this is the next day and the car was started, the carbs adjusted a little and off I went. I drove up to visit Jim Lindsey a little then headed back home. When I turned onto Highway 20, I stuck my foot in it and it took off.

The gas pedal stuck to the floor but then came up pretty quickly. The car then just stopped running so I coasted into the parking lot of Cherokee film something.

I played with the carbs and linkage then the distributor, rotor and points to no avail. My next call was to AAA. They showed up an hour and a half later, loaded my car and brought us home.

This is the same situation I had last year that resulted in a different distributor. So now the detective work begins, why did it die.


4/10/2025 – I took a few days off to mope and complain but today the housekeepers were here, so I had to go somewhere so I picked the shop.

With the 8 moved out of the way it looked a little bad in sunlight, so the California Car Duster was used to get the sprinkled-on dust off, and it looks better.

The 6 was lowered and the bonnet raised. Since the carbs had stuck open when the problem

arose, I started with working on the linkage.

The connection rod and the spring clamps were removed.



The rod needed some of the bends removed so it was straightened and a minimal bend placed where needed.

The spring clamps were not assembled correctly. A couple of screws were inserted with washers on the threaded end of the screw which pushes the nuts away from the stops built into the clip causing the nut to turn as tightening the screw was attempted. One clamp was bent and had to be straightened so the nut would not turn during tightening.

Inside the car, the pedal for the fuel supply was clamped in the same height as the other pedals, desired position, and the connecting rod adjusted to attach to the lever on the firewall

without moving the pedal. The rod was adjusted for length and attached to the lever and all of the slack removed from the clamps/rod/carb shafts. It sounds confusing and it kind of is if you have not done it before.

Finally, the carbs vacuum was checked and again adjusted. This process often takes several attempts to get correct.

I am still working on issues created by the DPO.

The second reason the car was carried home by AAA was the ignition system. The distributor cap and the rotor were removed.

The cog in the rotor that connects to the distributor shaft was missing. For some reason it broke off. Fortunately, there was a spare in the shop stash.

I did not have my glasses when the event happened so working on the distributor by braille was not successful for me, but it is now fixed and as soon as lunch is over a test drive is going to happen. Wish me luck.

So, the test drive led to more time in the shop. The car had a miss so a little wiggle this, pull on that let me know that one of the spark plug wires was not fully pushed into place so that fixed the miss.

The dwell angle was checked and needed adjustment up to a reading of 35 by resetting the points, and the timing was changed a little bit to about 12°BTD. No more test drives today, tired. It is getting better though.

4/11/2025 – Another test drive was in order, so I drove up to Collinsville for gas. I was glad to see the fuel gauge was working so I guess all gauges are working to some degree.

The next project is to remove the speedometer and put one drop of 3 in 1 oil down the cable connect hole. I learned this from a guy working on my 67 Stingray back in the day.

With a little more confidence in reliability it is probably time to schedule the remaining work to finish the interior, covering the wheel wells.

Since I used the last good rotor from my stash, I contacted Advanced Distributor to order a few more. He responded that he no longer sells parts but does still rebuild distributors, which is good news. He referred me to Moss for good rotors.

4/13/2025 – Today the speedometer was removed. The two retaining nuts and shims were removed first. Then the connections to the voltage stabilizer were removed. Next the cable that drives the speedometer then the retainer nut that connects the adjuster for the odometer to the flange on the underside of the dash. With everything disconnected the gauge was removed from the dash.

With the gauge on the workbench, one drop of oil from the 3 in 1 can was applied to the cable connection point. An old tach cable was found and used to spin the gauge via a small drill motor. It moved so it was reinstalled.

Think reverse of the above paragraph, except the rubber O ring around the gauge was put in place before the gauge was pushed into its dash location.

A test drive indicated that the gauge was working a teeny bit better than before the oil was added. It is still off about 10 MPH but there is less bouncing of the needle. Mabe it will heal up now. Until it does, the new GPS speedometer is working well, and I have a compass, but no clock yet. I am not understanding the setting process. ©

4/19/2025 – On Wednesday I decided to follow up with the status of the car after driving it to the meeting on Tuesday.

I checked the oil, and the level was over a quart low. Then I checked the numbers 2 and 5 spark plugs to see if rebuilding the head eliminated the fouling condition. It did not, the plugs were very black, indicating the problem remains.

On Friday I gave the car to my stepson whose son is also a master mechanic. Maybe they can give it the corrective measures needed to make it road worthy and complete the restoration.

Before he takes it home, I am going to adjust the right headlight and repair the right turn signal function.

I bought this car, that I really did not want, to keep me off the couch and busy as opposed to watching TV. It fulfilled that purpose, and I have enjoyed a lot of the work done on the car, both what I have done and what other members have helped me with. Thanks to all, especially Jim Lindsey.

So now Aaron can finish the engine, interior, and hood alignment. I will drive the 8.

4/22/2025 – Aaron arrived today about 10:30 to pick up the TR6 and haul it to Bentonville, AR. It took a couple of hours to go over all of the stuff that I wanted him to know about the car. We covered it pretty well.



Then we talked about oil and coolant and brake fluid. Darn, I forgot gear oil. He loves the car for various reasons. He values our history with the Topaz car and the interaction with each other and his son Jack as do I.

I know that there is a lot of enjoyment to be had between father and son, and I am glad to be able to contribute to that.

We spent less than an hour at the tag agency getting all the paperwork done. There was a lot more than I expected but we got it done.

Now all I need to do is cancel the insurance and turnpike information. I do not anticipate missing that car. It was never going to be what I wanted it to be. It served its purpose, so it was here and now it is not, and I am fine with that.








JOHN'S QUICK TIPS

Plug Lead Positions (Fig. 55)

Ensure that the plug leads are attached to the sparking plugs as shown. Firing order is 1, 5, 3, 6, 2, 4, taken in anti-clockwise order, as viewed from the top of the rotor arm.



TR6 Soft Top Folding

To prevent window damage when top is down fold TR6 top as shown.



Unsnap the top from the rear bow and beneath each side window. Spread over boot lid.



2. Fold top forward without folding back window



3. Fold side windows on top without folding side windows, tuck top down behind seats, add cover.

LESSONS LEARNED

When using an electronic ignition system bypass of the ballast resistor is highly recommended. This resistor is for protection of ignition points (which are no longer part of the system) and lowers voltage to the plugs. All 12 V are needed. Exception: Leave Tach wiring if applicable. When diff seals leak, clean the vent. Cleaning the vent releases pressure in the diff and many times stops leaks.

Coolant hoses get loose over time. Be sure to tighten them periodically.

The rear hubs on IRS cars are known to shear causing the wheel to separate from car while moving. Check by moving the raised wheel in the caster/camber attitude to check for play. There should be none

Thrust bearing end float should be .011" max. Push the crank shaft (fan) rearward as far as it will go. The crank should move forward when the clutch is depressed. It should move between .004" (0.1016 mm) and .011" (0.2794 mm).
